Do you like mysteries? Do your students think CSI is cool? If so, you are invited to apply for the Creating Student Investigators institute at Arkansas State University. Using forensic science as a theme, 7- 12 grade teachers will acquire educational strategies to promote student investigation, technology use, and inquiry based on the new science frameworks. Scientists, teachers, and students will team up to investigate a rash of events disturbing the quiet make-believe community of Proximity Parish.

When: Week 1 (June 9 - 13, 2008) Teachers will learn to integrate basic science concepts and investigative techniques using a forensics perspective.

Week 2 (June 16 - 21, 2008) Teachers will pilot the new ideas and concepts by working with 7th- 12th grade students who will be joining us for Week 2. (commitment by teachers for both weeks is required)

Where: Arkansas State University, Jonesboro, AR (lodging and meals provided)

Will it cost me anything? Not a thing! Teachers will receive a stipend of up to \$1200 for successful completion of the program (summer institute and academic year follow-up activities) *plus* tuition if graduate credit is desired.
